Push Your Limits at Camp

If your student or child is interested in attending a camp or program just for blind or low vision students, consider one of these great options! All programs run annually, so keep these options in mind as your child grows.

Teen Summer Camp at Leader Dogs for the Blind

Dates: June 22-28, 2025

Cost: Free, including transportation, accommodations and meals **Location:** Rochester Hills, MI

Criteria/Program: For 16-17-year-olds who are legally blind. Program combines fun activities with exploring mobility options, discovering leadership skills and building friendships with peers facing similar challenges. Campers receive a free HumanWare GPS to help increase their travel independence. They also have the opportunity to learn about living and working with a guide dog.

The Vision Resource Center (VRC) includes books in braille and large print for all ages and reading levels, but perhaps our largest collection is Twin Vision books. Twin Vision books contain both braille and regular print and usually have colorful pictures, like many children's books. These books are great for kids to read alone, but even better for kids and parents or caregivers to read together!

Twin Vision books were designed in 1960, by Jean Dyon Norris to enable visually impaired parents to read to their sighted children or sighted parents to read with their visually impaired children.

We have hundreds of Twin Vision books just waiting to be read by you! Our collection includes many popular characters like Pete the Cat, Amelia Bedelia, and the Berenstain Bears and popular authors like Dr. Seuss, Eric Carle and Mo Willems. You can meet new friends in Twin Vision books like Clark the Shark, or re-visit old friends like Frog and Toad in Frog and Toad Together. A personal favorite is The Three Ninja Pigs where three pigs learn to stand up to the Big Bad Wolf with their awesome ninja moves.
